I am Dr Anjolie Chhabra, a Professor of Anaesthesiology, working at AIIMS, New Delhi.

As many of you may be aware, I am standing for the post of National executive committee member in the forthcoming election of the IAPA to be held from the 16-18th of April 2023.

I would like to briefly introduce myself and tell you why I am contesting this election:

- 1. I have been working in a mixed practice setting that includes providing anaesthesia for paediatric patients undergoing Ophthalmic, Orthopaedic and Paediatric surgery including Non-operating room anaesthesia (NORA) for various radiological and diagnostic procedures for the last 25 years.
